ROD OLSON, CEO RETIRES

After 23 years of serving Vernon Communications Cooperative, Rod Olson has officially retired as CEO and General Manager.

The communications industry has been in his blood since he was a young boy, following in his father's footsteps who was also in the industry. Prior to VC Co-op, he worked for 22 years for other telephone companies in Sparta and Viroqua. Because of his knowledge and expertise in the industry, his reputation precedes him. His accomplishments are many and this names a few:

During his tenure, Rod has spent countless hours serving the members and employees of the cooperative. He put the members of the cooperative first and led the team to ensure the cooperative delivered the best value of services and technology to this rural region. VC Co-op offers state-of-the-art technology and that is in part due to his leadership. Rod has written several grants through the State of Wisconsin to build fiber in underserved areas, which we have been awarded and are continually working to increase our serving area. VC Co-op is one of 31 telcos that own Wisconsin Independent Network (WIN) Technologies. WIN oversees Airstream, Indatel and Midwest Video Solutions (MVS) providing network, data security and IT services throughout the Midwest. Rod served on the WIN Board and MVS Board helping oversee and grow the company to serve over 25 telcos in 6 states, providing service to over 30,000 video subscribers. This was the first IPTV provider in North America. As CEO, he was never afraid to dig in the trenches, spearhead new ideas and bring them to fruition.

Rod has given presentations at conferences both internationally and across the country (including the White House) about the innovative technology and services that Vernon has been a part of developing. He has been instrumental in forming partnerships and companies to promote these efforts. Along with WIN and MVS, he has also served on several industry and area boards and committees including the National Telecommunications Cooperative Association, Wisconsin State Telecommunications Association, Wisconsin Locally Owned Telephone Association, Cooperative Network, Midwest Telnet, Vernon Memorial Healthcare, Fortress Bank, Westby Norse Fund, and Westby Coon Prairie Lutheran Church to name a few. He recently served on the Governor's Next Generation Statewide 911 Network committee, developing a new statewide 911 system.

His entrepreneur spirit and leadership will be missed and his legacy with the cooperative will live on for years to come. Congratulations to Rod and we wish him and his family a long and happy retirement.





















MALVERTISING

What is Malvertising?

Malicious advertising, known as malvertising, is when cybercriminals use ads to spread malware or use ads to trick users into providing sensitive information. When browsing a webpage, if you click on a malicious ad, you may be taken to a phony login page or a fake retail website that will ask for your sensitive information. Some malvertising can even download malicious files onto your system.

FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO STAY SAFE FROM HARMFUL ADS:

- Think before you click! If something seems too good to be true, it probably is.
- Stay up-to-date with security patches on your device and your browser.
- Install a reputable ad blocker for your browser. Ad blockers help protect you from malvertising by preventing ads from being displayed.

4 Reasons To Replace Your Old Router

1. Your old router is easier to hack

Your router may be doing a fine job keeping you connected to the internet, but is it keeping you safe? The latest security standard is WPA-3. Any router that uses WPA-2 encryption needs to be replaced.

2. You're missing out

When buying a router, you might as well future-proof your network. More and more devices support Wi-Fi 6, but that doesn't mean a thing if your router doesn't. Wi-Fi 6 significantly improves two critical categories: speed and range.

3. Your signal is weak in certain spots

Your home should have a consistent, speedy network. A single router works fine for small spaces, but what about multiple rooms and floors?

Mesh networks are more popular and affordable than ever. Rather than relying on one router, a mesh network adds satellite modules around your home, blanketing the entire area with coverage.

These systems usually come in sets of two or more units that work together. As far as your gadgets are concerned, the Wi-Fi mesh is one big continuous network that eliminates poor coverage, dead spots, and buffering.

4. Your devices need more juice

How old is your router? Routers that only support 2.4 GHz frequencies are dinosaurs. Single-band routers only utilize the 2.4 GHz band and one wireless signal. Dual-band routers use 2.4 and 5 GHz bands to transmit two simultaneous wireless signals, providing better performance. Tri-band routers typically have 2.4 and 5 GHz bands and an additional 5 or 6 GHz band to transmit three total wireless signals. Single-band routers need to be replaced. A dual-band router that supports 2.4 and 5 GHz will do the job for homes with less than five connected devices. Get a tri-band router that supports three signals for homes with more than five connected devices.

5. How to choose a new router

Connect your home and all your devices over Wi-Fi with a wireless home router.

The bottom line is this: Replacing the router is a must if your connection is spotty, isn't equipped with the latest security standards, or is more than three years old.
