FROM THE CEO



Hello everyone and welcome to Spring, contrary to the snowstorm we just had! Now that spring has finally arrived, we can jump back into our construction projects. If you recall, we're building fiberto-the-home (FTTH) in Crawford County as part of a recent grant. This project started in 2022 and we hope to complete it before summer's end. This will extend FTTH to over

800 new customers! The next major project we have in queue is our expansion into Monroe County. The cooperative received two grants in 2022 to expand fiber to residences in Monroe County. The timeline for these grants is 2023-24. We will begin this construction as we finish Crawford County and will complete in 2024, expanding FTTH to another 1,100 + locations. The cooperative will continue to review and apply for state and federal grants that help expand fiber to rural Wisconsin locations. The importance of fast dependable broadband for our rural areas cannot be overstated and we're proud of our ability to expand into areas that don't have it.

Another topic I'd like to remind everyone of is, digging safely. *Please call 811 prior to digging in your yard or ditch.* We've already experienced one fiber hit this Spring that could have been avoided by calling 811. Another way to help the cooperative preserve it's network is being very careful of our hand holes when burning ditches. Burning ditches can damage our hand holes and the fiber within them, causing loss of service and the necessity to replace fiber. Calling 811 prior to digging, and being very careful where you burn are two easy free ways to help preserve the cooperative's fiber network.

Lastly, I hope you were able to join us for our 2023 Annual Meeting and that you found the meeting to be informative. We will continue to review our options for the Annual meeting with the focus on trying to reach as many members as possible.

CYBER SECURITY



How to Safely Shop Online

Do you regularly use your debit card for online purchases?

Do you have payment information saved on online shopping accounts? Do you use autofill to enter your payment information?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, your payment information may be at risk. Online retailers are a popular target for cybercriminals, which makes your information vulnerable to a data breach. A data breach is when a cyberattack results in the theft of private user information.

If you shop online and want to secure your payment information from a data breach, consider the following tips:

Avoid Making Payments With Debit Cards

When you make purchases online, always use a credit card instead of a debit card. Debit cards are linked to your bank account, so if a bad guy can access your debit card information, they can access your entire bank account. Because debit cards use the cash available in your bank, disputing a charge can lead to the long and complicated process of replacing stolen funds. Credit card purchases add to your debt, which means that a fraudulent charge won't immediately impact your finances. Using a credit card for online purchases allows you to dispute a charge, without losing access to your cash.

Avoid Saving Payment Methods for Future Purchases

When you shop online, many retailers offer to save your payment information for future purchases. While this option is more convenient than entering your payment information every time you shop, always decline saving this information. Unfortunately, data breaches happen and even the most reputable online retailers are vulnerable to a breach. Avoid saving your payment method altogether so that your information is not at risk during a cyber attack.

Avoid Saving Payment Methods for Autofill

When you make purchases online, internet browsers such as Chrome, Edge, and Firefox offer to save your payment information for autofill. Even if it is more convenient to use the autofill feature, always decline saving this information. If bad guys physically or remotely gain access to your browser, they can steal any information that your browser stores for autofill purposes. It may be inconvenient to manually enter your payment information every time you shop online, but the inconvenience is worth keeping your information secure.

CEO ADVOCATES FOR BROADBAND



Vernon Communications CEO, Garin Mayer, attended the Wisconsin State Telecommunications Association (WSTA) Government Relations Seminar at the state capital. During the seminar, Garin was able to meet with Representative Loren Oldenburg, Representative Steven Doyle, and Senator Brad Pfaff to advocate for broadband access to under served Wisconsin communities. In today's ever changing world of technology, quality access to high-speed internet is critical for rural communities, like ours, to unlock potential for commerce, health care, education, agriculture and more! Internet is the backbone of today's world. It powers education and economy, supports our health and well-being and it connects us to our neighbors and family. Roughly 1 in 5 American households aren't connected to the Internet. That's a fifth of our country that's unable to fully participate in modern life. According to a Wisconsin Public Radio article published in December of 2022, it is estimated that 16% of Wisconsin homes lack access to guality internet (speeds above 100/20 Mbps). We hope our work, along with the WSTA, can change that!

INTERNET SECURITY TIPS

- Don't forget to reboot your WiFi routers. A simple reboot is often enough to considerably improve your WiFi speeds. A reboot clears the router's memory and allows updates to install.
- Cut off WiFi leeches Today an encrypted, passwordprotected WiFi is a must. More people than ever rely on WiFi, and the hunger for open, fast WiFi networks is real. Don't think that your neighbors won't use your WiFi network just because they have their own.
- You should encryp your WiFi and protect it with a strong password that can't be easily guessed.
- Include a combination of upper and lowercase letters, symbols, and numbers.
- Don't use common passwords like 123456.
- Make sure the password is at least 8 characters long. Short passwords can be easily guessed.
- Use a unique password and don't write it on a piece of paper. If you can't remember it, use a password manager.
