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CRAWFORD COUNTY

VC Co-op's fiber construction project in Crawford County will be complete by the end of the month. Over 150 miles of fiber have been put into the ground, and nearly 900 residential and business customers will now have access to the best in fiber optic technology.

This project was a long time coming for many residents of Crawford County. Many residents were unable to receive the internet speeds they need to do homework, work remotely, and have access to the basic necessities the internet has to offer.

The availability of communication is essential to today's needs and the infrastructure of broadband technology is increasingly important to everyone. We are proud to have played a role in bringing this project to fruition and we are grateful to the residents of Crawford County for their patience and support.

We are happy to report the residents who were most affected by the lack of high-speed internet now have the speeds they need to navigate the internet, stream video and work from home. We believe this project will have a positive impact on the economic development of Crawford County and we are excited to see what the future holds.

CYBER SECURITY



You know that little pop-up prompting you to restart your computer for a software update? The one that only seems to come up when you're in the middle of something important? As annoying as it may seem, this notification is actually a valuable asset to your cybersecurity. So, before you click the "Later" option, let's take a closer look!

What is a software update?

A software update is a new and improved version of a program, application, or operating system that you are already using. The update may include new features, bug fixes, or important security patches.

Why are updates important for cybersecurity?

Do you ever wonder how secure the programs installed on your device are? Cybercriminals do. They look for cracks in the security of programs and use these vulnerabilities to gain access to your device. With this access, they could enable a keylogger to track what you type, steal confidential information, or even install ransomware to lock you out of your files and demand payment for access. Developers help prevent this by fixing vulnerabilities as soon as possible. These fixes are included in software updates. Meaning, the longer you wait to install the update, the longer your system is at risk.

How do I check for software updates?

Any device that runs software, be it a computer, tablet, or even a smart tv, can release updates. Most software will prompt you when an update is available, but it's good practice to check periodically. Here is a general guide to checking for updates on common platforms:

Mac System Updates (for macOS Catalina)

- 1. Open the Apple menu and select About this Mac.
- 2. Click Software Updates....
- 3. If any are available, you will have the option to install it

Windows System Updates (for Windows 10)

- 1. Open the start menu and select Settings.
- 2. Select Update & Security Settings then select Windows Update.
- 3. Click Check for Updates. If any are available, you will have the option to install it.

iOS Updates

- 1. Open the Settings app and tap General.
- 2. Tap Software Update.
- 3. If any are available, you will have the option to install it.

Android Updates (for most devices running Android 10 or higher)

- 1. Open the Settings app and go to the System section.
- 2. Tap About Phone. (If this is not an option, skip to step 3.)
- 3. Tap System Updates.
- Tap Check for Update. If any are available, you will have the option to install it.

QUALITY INTERNET

Factors That Can Affect An Internet Connection

Location - A router is key to a great internet connection and the placement of that router is important. Where you place your router determines the range or coverage of your internet. Minimize the distance between the router and your devices for maximum efficiency. Place your Wi-Fi in a central location of the home, such that the internet is equally distributed to all your spaces.

Hardware - Ensure your hardware is updated as most innovation and upgrades enhance efficiency. With upgraded equipment, you'll enjoy better internet quality and speed. A bad wireless router can make your internet seem slow, causing buffering, lags and even drops in service.

Connectivity - Generally a cable connection is faster than a wireless network. Use a wired connection for devices that require high bandwidth. If you are gaming or streaming video, you may want to use a wired connection for those devices. The internet speed is equally important in ensuring a faster connection.

Internet Use - If you operate several applications or operations at once this could create a slower internet connection.

Number of Users - The number of internet users in your household will affect your internet's speed. The amount of devices connected at once, can also affect your connection.

Home materials - Other factors that can influence your connection are thick walls and floors, plaster walls, metal buildings, tin roof and in-floor heating.

NEW AREA CODE

Beginning September 15, 2023, customers in the 608 area code region may be assigned a number in the new 353 area code when they request new service or an additional line. Customers receiving the 353 area code will be required to dial the area code and phone number for all local calls, just as customers with telephone



numbers from the 608 area code currently dial. This is to ensure a continuing supply of telephone numbers, the Public Service Commission (PSC) of Wisconsin has approved on all services overlay for the 608 area code. The 608 area code serves the southwestern portion of the state, as will the new area code also serving the same geographic area.
