FROM THE CEO



We often get asked, why are television prices so high? TV prices are high for a number of reasons, but the primary reason is the cost of programming. TV programmers, such as sports leagues (think ESPN, Big 10, etc), and networks such as CBS, TNT, NBC, etc., charge cable and satellite companies high fees for the right to carry their content. These costs are ultimately passed on to

you the consumer in the form of higher TV bills.

Another reason for high TV prices is the popularity of sports entertainment. In fact, sports programming is a major driver of TV costs. Sports rights are extremely expensive, and TV programmers are willing to pay a lot of money to secure the rights to broadcast sporting events. This is because sports programming is very popular with viewers, and it can attract high advertising rates. News and the cost of high salaries paid to actors and actresses are another driver of expensive programming. Think about the salaries of these performers and how much they get paid. Someone has to recoup those charges, and that is the consumer.

Last, most TV programmers have established requirements for what channels need to go into each package. We often get asked why we can't offer an "a la carte" channel package where you choose the channels you want? The rules are set by the programmers on the specific type of package their network can be in. VC Co-op does not have the option to place those channels into their own package.

While we have no control over the cost each TV programmer chooses to pass onto us, we do work with several partners such as Midwest Video Solutions (MVS) and National Content & Technology Cooperative (NCTC) to help negotiate licensing and agreements to keep the impact of rising costs as minimal as we can. Even so, we know how frustrating these increases can be on you, so we've outlined a few things you can do if the cost of TV is getting beyond your reach.

- Switch to streaming: Streaming services such as Netflix, Hulu, and Amazon Prime Video can be more affordable options than cable or satellite TV. However, it's important to note that streaming services may not offer all of the same channels and content as cable or satellite TV. The elimination of set-top-boxes can help save money.
- Contact your local officials: You can contact your elected officials and advocate for policies that would make TV more affordable. For example, you could support policies that would require TV programmers to sell their content on an a la carte basis.
- Downgrade your current package to a less expensive alternative and stream other options that suit your needs.

CYBER SECURITY



During the month of October, VC Co-op ran some Facebook posts giving away items to celebrate Co-op month. Unfortunately, a scammer created a brand new page that looked just like our Facebook page. Their goal was to bait our fans into giving out their personal information. By commenting back to those who entered the giveaway saying they had won would direct them to click a link. While this replicated page looked just like the VC Co-op Facebook page, it was in fact, not our account and unless you looked deeper into the page, no one would have known it was not legitimate. After receiving some calls about winning, we realized we have been the recipient of identity fraud!!

This is common practice for scammers who do this for a living and know exactly what they are doing. Please note: **WE WOULD NEVER ASK YOU FOR PERSONAL INFORMATION OVER FACEBOOK**. It is unfortunate that we live in a world where we need to constantly be on the lookout for suspicious behavior.

This is what we learned:

If you suspect that you have been the victim of identity fraud on social media, go to the impersonating profile or page.

- Make sure the address is correct on the page, see if there are archive posts, or any posts at all. If you can't find it, try searching for the name used on the profile or page or asking your friends if they can send you a link to it.
- Click the cover photo If there are no posts or information about the page, beware.
- If you're reporting a page, select "Find support or report page." If you're reporting a profile, select "Find support or report profile".
- Follow the on-screen instructions for impersonation to file a report.

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

The Affordable Connectivity Program is a Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service. This new benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward broadband service for eligible households. Eligible households can enroll online with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) or by a mail in application.

Who is Eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program?

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines
- Participates in one of the assistance programs: Free and reduced-price school lunch program or school breakfast program. Including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision: SNAP; Medicaid: Federal public Housing Assistance; SSI; WIC; Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits or Lifeline
- Participates in Tribal specific programs
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year
- Meets the eligibility criteria for participating provider's existing low-income program
