Hello Everyone,

I hope you had a chance to enjoy summer. We say it all the time, but it certainly feels like time moves faster and faster.

With all the excitement happening with the road construction in Westby, they even managed to sneak in a visit from the President of the United States! The President visited Westby, specifically



Vernon Electric to unveil a grant award for green energy that Dairyland Power would be receiving. Part of this announcement was a small mention of broadband. If you recall, the Cooperative was successful in receiving a grant with the partnership of Crawford County and the American Rescue Plan Act, (ARPA) in providing funding. This grant program allowed the cooperative to pass an additional 1,000+ homes

with fiber-to-the-home. As part of the President's visit, the White House reached out to VernonCom looking for success stories surrounding that grant program. Our staff was quick to come up with several stories of how fiber-to-the home, and excellent broadband, had helped resident's in the grant area. Members of particular mention are Emile and Camille Smith. The Smith's have been instrumental in pushing for broadband in Crawford County for years, leading up to the project as part of the 3C Co-op. Their work paid off in helping make the grant possible. When asked if they would be willing to provide information to the White House, the Smith's jumped at the chance! Not only were they able to attend the ceremony, but they met with the President and had a follow up video call with him, where they were able to convey how much broadband means to rural Wisconsin families.

Our community has enjoyed broadband for years, however, certain areas in Crawford and Monroe County haven't shared in that enjoyment. Building fiber-to-the-home, business or farm, is a game changer for them. They can now work from home, complete school work, enjoy streaming, and maybe even have a video call with the President!

As I've mentioned before, we're proud to provide world-class broadband to our members, and we're always excited to extend that network to areas where it's so desperately needed. We will vet out opportunities and continue to try to add more broadband to our corner of the world.

Cyber Security - KnowB4

Artificial intelligence (AI) tools are becoming increasingly popular with individuals and organizations. While AI tools can be helpful, it's important to consider the security risks of sharing sensitive information and data with these tools.

Storing Your Information

Al tools collect and store large amounts of the information shared with them. Depending on the Al tool you use, your user data, conversations, feedback, and location can be collected and even reviewed by human Al trainers. These tools use this shared information to improve the content they generate. If the Al tool you use experiences a breach, your sensitive information could land in the hands of cybercriminals.

Spoofed AI Tools

Cybercriminals can also spoof legitimate Al tools or even create their own. If they trick you into using their versions of Al tools, you could be sharing information directly with cybercriminals and putting yourself at risk. With these malicious Al tools, cybercriminals can create specialized prompts and inputs designed to manipulate you into sharing sensitive information.

What Can I Do to Stay Safe?

Follow the tips below to keep your information safe when using AI tools:

 Use well-known and secure AI tools. Verify that the AI tools are

legitimate and choose tools that have been developed with data security in mind.

 Limit the information that you share. Only share details that are necessary for the AI tool to function and exclude any identifying information.

Do your research.
 Familiarize yourself with the privacy policies of Al tools to understand the data privacy risks.



TV Changes Coming

Effective November 12, 2024, we will be adjusting our TV channel lineup. We aim to reduce the number of channels from two (SD and HD) to one television network. Standard Definition (SD) channel numbers will now carry High Definition (HD) content. For example, instead of WKBT Channel 8 for SD and 308 for HD, we will only have channel 8, which would be in HD. This allows members to have better picture quality, while we optimize our network performance. Although this transition may require some adjustment for members who are accustomed to using HD channel numbers, the long-term benefits outweigh the initial inconvenience.
