October is Cyber Security Awareness Month

Cyber security is a hot topic we all need to take seriously. Criminals are becoming more savvy in accessing private information. According to KnowB4, Phishing attacks are surging at an unprecedented 1,265% rate since 2022, largely driven by Al advancements. October is cyber security awareness month, so here are some tips to keep you safe online:

Using strong, unique passwords for every account, with a password manager

Back up important data especially your offline external drive, 4 times a year at a minimum

Use multi-factor authentication (MFA) to help secure your accounts. MFA requires an additional security code when logging in

Always use unique, strong passwords for each of your digital subscription accounts. Never reuse the same password across many accounts, and change your passwords regularly

Share your photos and videos safely.
Your phone adds hidden location details
to your photos, called geotagging.
You can remove geotagging from your
pictures and videos through your smart
phone's settings

Be careful what you share! Don't show personal documents, ID cards, or credit cards in photos you share online

Check URL's for things like misspellings, unofficial domain names, and sneaky sub-domains to protect yourself against phishing links

Update software regularly

CPNI

Your privacy matters! Because it is Cyber Security month, we want to update you about CPNI (Customer Proprietary Network Information). This is the telecommunications version of HIPPA (the healthcare accountability act), which is regulated by the FCC. When members set up service all telecommunications providers are required to have privacy information on file to protect you and your account. When a customer signs up for service a password is required to be placed on the account, authorized users and a pin number. In order for us to talk to you about your account, we have to ask this information prior to giving out any details on your account in order to know who we are talking to. It is very important you keep this information on file for your own records and any authorized user, in order to retrieve access information on your account. When a member calls we are required to ask this information in order to prove we are talking to the account holder. This is for your security.



Robo calls are still a top complaint among consumers. Whether it be on your landline phone or cell phone, here are some tips to avoid phone scams:

- Don't answer unknown numbers
- Beware: Caller ID showing a local number, does not necessarily mean it is a local call
- If you answer the phone and the caller asks you to hit a button, just hang up
- Do not respond to any questions especially those that can be answered "yes"
- Never give out personal information of any kind
- If you get an inquiry from someone who says they represent a company or government agency, hang up and call the phone number on your statement account to verify authenticity.

School Supplies Donation

The Daily Brew in Westby is a small coffee shop with a big personality. At the corner of Hwy 14 and Washington Street, The Daily Brew not only offers coffee, but a great selection of drinks and food. Garrick and Kassi Olerud identified a community need in Westby where people could gather, socialize, use WiFi, get a great cup of coffee and a bite to eat. The coffee shop opened on June 1, 2021, after seeing the building vacant for 3 years.

Their motto is: "Where coffee and Community come together". They serve fresh coffee from Bean Juice daily, along with a variety of other drinks like espresso, lotus, flights, teas, cold brews, wine, and beer. They also prioritize using local products and offer a great variety of food where breakfast and lunch are served everyday.

Their constant flow of new ideas is a result of their entrepreneurial spirit. This summer, they introduced a food truck in partnership with Zandrea Mason, which is available for events in local communities. Wednesday nights are burger nights, where \$2.00 from each burger is donated to a specified nonprofit, club, organization or sports. The first Friday night of the month are interactive social nights for trivia or puzzle nights. "Brew it Forward" is a way to pay for someones coffee or meal. They also supply coffee and offer support to "Norse Brew", which is a coffee cart in Westby's Middle and High School.

They credit their success to their employees. Amy Ellefson is the manager and she manages 25 total employees, five of which are full-time.

The coffee shop is open Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 6:30 am - 4 pm. Wednesday and Friday, from 6:30 am - 8 pm. Saturday 7:00 am - 3 pm and Sunday 7 am - 1 pm.

Daily Brew uses VernonCom for their POS and internet connection with three different WiFi networks and they also have our TV product.
